

Greetings from Jackson Center Schools!

The school year is in full swing and we are off to a great start! The staff and students are becoming accustomed to new routines, new surroundings and all the possibilities that the building will bring. There is still a great deal of work to be done, but the progress is remarkable and the campus is certainly revitalized. All you have to do is walk or drive around the school grounds and something exciting changes each day. Thanks for all your patience as we near the end of the project and all the final pieces are put into place.

Report Card

If you saw the results of the 2016-17 local report card in the newspapers, you probably noticed different letter grades in different categories. The state will make the claim that they are not trying to confuse you, but many people in education and otherwise think differently. Regardless, the breakdown for all the different categories will help us build on our successes and focus on areas where we need to improve. If you are looking for a short synopsis, I would look to the Achievement grade of a 'C' and the Value Added grade of an 'A'. The achievement score tells us how the kids did in that snapshot in time last spring. While we are not happy with a 'C', we were only 0.5% away from a 'B' and had our advanced math kids taken their grade level test instead of the subject level test, we would have easily scored a 'B'. No extra credit is given to those advanced math kids even though they are taking tests 1 or 2 years ahead of when the state thinks that they should. Regardless of how the tests are structured, our philosophy has been that we want kids taking the classes that they are capable of taking. We will worry about the state tests later. The 'A' in value added means that our kids are growing at MORE than one year's growth and we are of course very proud of that score. Some other highlights include:

- The 3rd grade having the highest percentage of passage in Shelby County in language arts and the 2nd highest percentage in math (this has been very consistent over the past couple of years)
- The 4th grade for having 100% passage in math and having the highest passage rate in the county
- Our juniors and seniors having the highest passage rate for government in the county (I believe this is a few years running)
- Our freshman and sophomores scoring the 2nd highest passage rate for American History, (Another con-






About a year ago, the Jackson Center Tiger Boosters reached out to alumni with a goal to raise enough money to finish some of the projects not included in the state/school district agreement.





Pay Attention to Attendance: Keep Your Child On Track in Middle and High School

Showing up for school has a huge impact on a student's academic success starting in kindergarten and continuing through high school. Even as children grow older and more independent, families play a key role in making sure students get to school safely every day and understand why attendance is so important for success in school and on the job.

DID YOU KNOW?

- · Students should miss no more than 9 days of school each year to stay engaged, successful and on track to graduation.
- Absences can be a sign that a student is losing Interest in school, struggling with school work, dealing with a builty or facing some other potentially serious difficulty.
- By 6th grade, absenteeism is one of three signs that a student may drop out of high school.
- By 9th grade, regular and high attendance is a better predictor of graduation rates than 8th grade test scores.
- . Missing 10 percent, or about 18 days, of the school year can drastically affect a student's academic success.
- · Students can be chronically absent even if they only miss a day or two every few weeks.
- · Attendance is an important life skill that will help your child graduate from college and keep a job.

WHAT YOU CAN DO

Make school attendance a priority

- Talk about the importance of showing up to school everyday, make that the expectation.
- · Help your child maintain daily routines, such as finishing homework and getting a good night's sleep.
- · Try not to schedule dental and medical appointments during the school day.
- . Don't let your child stay home unless truly sick. Complaints of headaches or stomach aches may be signs of anxiety.

Help your teen stay engaged

- Find out if your child feels engaged by his classes and feels safe from bullies and
 other threats. Make sure he/she is not missing class because of behavioral issues
 and school discipline policies. If any of these are problems, work with your school.
- Stay on top of academic progress and seek help from teachers or tutors if necessary. Make sure teachers know how to contact you.
- Stay on top of your child's social contacts. Peer pressure can lead to skipping school, while students without many friends can feel isolated.
- Encourage meaningful afterschool activities, including sports and clubs.

Communicate with the school

- Know the school's attendance policy incentives and penalities
- Talk to teachers if you notice sudden changes in behavior. These could be tied to something going on at school.
- · Check on your child's attendance to be sure absences are not piling up.
- Ask for help from school officials, afterschool programs, other parents or community agencies if you're having trouble getting your child to school.
