### **Principals:**

• **Very Strong Test Scores:** Students continue to excel at various levels in state testing. On the yearly OGT test administered at the Sophomore level, Jackson Center was the only area school to score 100% on 4 of the 5 subject areas and a 97% on the other. As well, recently published results of last year's ACT scores show Jackson Center students were above the state average while results of the 3<sup>rd</sup> Grade OAA Reading reflected 91% of Jackson Center students passed (county Average 91%) while 71% passed at an Advanced Level. (County Average 56%).
