## Events:

As many of you already know, Jackson Center Schools will be closed on Monday, April $8^{\text {th }}$. This is now known as "Eclipse Day". Shelby County will be in one of the longest lasting paths of darkness in world and as a result, the Shelby County Emergency Management Agency (EMA) is predicting that we will experience almost 4 minutes of the moon passing in front of the sun on that day. This phenomenon is of particular interest to thousands of people across the globe so the EMA is also predicting that Shelby County will triple in population in preparation. As a result, they are predicting traffic and logistical issues for that weekend and especially on that Monday which means that we will be closed and all school events will be postponed. However, the Jackson Center Growth Association is planning a minicommunity days that weekend with camping spots, live bands, food trucks and more! Please mark your calendars!

We are wrapping up the $2^{\text {nd }}$ quarter and as winter marches on and we are awaiting the promise of spring, our indoor events will continue for the next few months. ## Winter Driving:

As a reminder, we will delay or cancel school if conditions are treacherous on our school district roads. Our main concern is young drivers and our busses. Most adults have enough experience driving in hazardous conditions, but many of our 16 and 17 year olds do not always take their time and use proper precautions. Our busses are also a concern because of the number of stops and starts they make during their routes. Sliding is an issue for them as well as the people around them. There is no exact science to calling a delay or cancellation, but we do work with the other local school districts and try to make the best call possible.

As the weather changes and more students walk or ride their bikes, it is a great time to remember that all of us need to slow down and follow all school guidelines at the beginning and end of the school day. All parents dropping off or picking up their students at school need to use the curb lane! Dropping off between cars or in the parking lanes is very dangerous for the students because they cannot always be seen clearly by other drivers. The only exception would be if an adult needs to walk their student to the door. In that case, the children need to stay with that adult. After school, please stay in your car and have your student look for you so the traffic keeps moving. Thank you for continuing to follow these simple guidelines and keep our kids free from harm.

## State Testing:

Finally, spring is also the time for state testing. Please make sure that your student is eating properly, getting enough sleep at night and encourage your student to show what they can do! We had our best academic year in many categories last year and we want to continue that trend!

In the second meeting held in October, the buddies went trick-or-treating together. Everyone went from classroom to classroom, getting some fun toys and treats. Our teachers were kind enough to let us do so. Our latest meeting in November was our Friendsgiving. FCCLA members helped supply our Thanksgiving feast. The buddies enjoyed their meal and asked some icebreaker questions together.

## Friendsgiving

In November, we held our chapter, "Friendsgiving" meal. Our members volunteered to bring different foods, such as desserts, vegetables, and fruits. Our advisor supplied us with our choice of meat, pulled pork. Some of our members enjoyed their meal with their buddies in TGIF (tigers, growing in friendship).


## FACTS

The Jackson Center FCCLA was once again the recipient of an Ohio Traffic Safety (FACTS Grant). The chapter worked collaboratively with local law enforcement and village workers to put on a traffic and car safety simulation at the Firehouse on Friday, Dec. 8. Prior to the simulation 9-12 students completed a survey regarding traffic and car safety.

The results of the survey were used to drive the project. Students came to the firehouse in grade level groups and visited 4 stations. The stations included checking and knowing your vehicle fluids, checking and changing a tire, traffic laws and distracted driving.

All students were given a seat belt cushion to encourage seat belt use, as students had indicated the main reasons they don't buckle up include lack of comfort or forgetfulness. On Dec. 21, a seat belt check was conducted as students arrived at school. A total of 30 cars were stopped containing 53 passengers. It was found that $88 \%$ of the students were wearing their seat belts, while $12 \%$ did not. All students were given an air freshener with a Tiger logo and the phrase "buckle up...someone needs you," to serve as a reminder to buckle up in the car.


## "Lacing it Together"

FCCLA member Kendall Hilbun has worked with the FCS wellness class and chapter members to carry out her service project "Lacing It All Together." The goal for this project was to create hygiene bags to donate to homeless shelters, youth crisis centers and food pantries in Ohio and Shelby County. A shoe drive fundraiser through fund2org was organized to support this project. A total of 1,150 pairs of shoes were collected. The chapter received .40 per pound of shoes donated. These funds were utilized to buy items for the kits. The shoes will then be donated to underprivileged countries. A total of 70 hygiene kits were distributed along with 5 cleaning buckets.


## Cups and Cuddles

FCCLA members Corinne York, Cortney Copeland, and Maleah Kipker have been working with the student body and chapter members to carry out their service project, 'Cups and Cuddles." The goal of the project is to provide needed items, which may be overlooked, for community members while delivering them in a nice mug or cup that has been sanitized, repurposed and then stuffed with hygiene supplies. These cups will be distributed to Rustic Hope and the Fish Pond Food Pantry. In addition, they have collected blankets to donate to the Shelby County Animal Shelter along with homemade dog treats and toys.



On October 30th, 2023 the Jackson Center UVCC sent three FFA members to the District Job Interview CDE. In this CDE competitors are asked to fill out a resume and interview for a job. The Job Interview CDE helps to develop life skills that will be needed when seeking employment such as writing resumes, cover letters, follow up letters \&participating in a mock personal interview.


November 1-3, 2023 the Jackson center UVCC FFA sent thirteen FFA members to the National Convention in Indianapolis, Indiana. On their way to Indianapolis they stopped to tour at a few different agriculturally related places including MVP Dairy, RSG Reproductive Specialty Group, and Ozark Fishery. They had the opportunity to attend a Rodeo \& Lainey Wilson Concert. But most importantly, FFA members experienced many sessions seeing old national officers give their retiring address and seeing new officers take their position, as well as meeting other FFA members from across the nation. There were over 78,000 FFA members and supporters in attendance this year.


On November 12, 2023 we held our November FFA Meeting where we had a Thanksgiving meal in the shop. We had each FFA member who attended bring a dish for the meal. During this meeting we moved to start the Canned Food Drive on November 27, 2023.


On November 13, 2023 our Advanced Parliamentary Procedure team competed in the Sub District Parliamentary Procedure contest. Our team practiced a lot before school to make sure that they did their best. The team placed third, just 9 points shy of advancing to the district contest.


On December 3, 2023 the Jackson Center UVCC FFA ran a booth at the Jackson Center Christmas in the Village. We had 11 members help run the booth by doing things such as helping little kids make paper snowflakes and hand out ice melt to their parents to keep their walkways clean \& safe during the winter months.


On December 11, 2023 the FFA chapter took 14 members to the Ohio FFA Leadership Night held at Anna HS. At the leadership night three state FFA officers led various different games while highlighting what leadership qualities they show to inspire the nest generation of leaders.


On December 10, 2023 the FFA chapter held its December meeting in the ag room. During the meeting members had the opportunity to participate in a white elephant gift exchange where they played a game to find out which gift they would receive.


December 12, 2023 the FFA chapter delivered our Collected Food \& Personal Care items collected by the students of Jackson Center Schools to the Fish Pond Food Pantry. We are excited to announce we collected over 1,400 food items and over 1,200 personal care items
