Eli did a great job representing Jackson Center, competing against 38 other schools in our region. Unfortunately Eli did not go onto Washington, but we are very proud of him.




## Two 4th Grade Billionaires--Sam Scott and Caleb Lotz

We had not one, but two 4<sup>th</sup> grade students read over a billion words so far this year!


A massive congratulations goes out to Sam Scott who has read 2,459,076 words and Caleb Lotz who has read 2,372,071 words so far this year.

This is the first ever Discovery Degree Ceremony held for the Jackson Center UVCC FFA chapter. The Discovery FFA Degree is the first degree a member can be eligible for, and it is intended for seventh grade members who participate in FFA activities and learn about the Organization in the classroom setting.

On January 13 and 14, 2024 Anna Hagen and Darrah Clabaugh participated in the Mission Leadership Conference, students at the Mission Conference explore what makes them unique and learn strategies to become a more confident and capable version of themselves. They explore values, strengths, decision-making skills and self-confidence. The Mission Conference culminates in students developing their personal mission statement. Cortney Copeland participated in the Impact Leadership Conference, the Impact Conference empowers students to define what their impact will be. Students will explore challenges facing their communities and strategies they can deploy to help. In addition, students will explore their values, practice innovative thinking and determine how they can inspire others. The Impact Conference culminates in students developing an Impact Plan to create change in their local community.

On January 27, 2024 the chapter's officer books were sent for evaluation. There are three books, one coming from the Treasurer, Kathryn Prenger, Secretary, Zoë Razzano, and Reporter, Owen Willoby. The Treasurer's book consists of an accurate record of receipts and disbursements for our chapter. The Secretary's book includes an organized record of all activities, agendas, and correspondence throughout the year. The Reporters book has 3 different parts including the scrapbook, social media, newsletters. Each of these three did an outstanding job, all receiving a perfect score.



On January 30, 2024 Riley Barhorst competed in the Extemporaneous Speaking CDE. In this CDE participants had to choose topics to write a speech about and then they were given only 30 minutes to research and prepare this speech. Riley placed 2<sup>nd</sup> at the Sub District Contest and 6<sup>th</sup> in the District Contest. Congratulations Riley!



Over the course of the month of March the General Livestock Judging CDE Team & Equine Team has been very active. Cortney Copeland represented the Jackson Center UVCC FFA in the General Livestock Judging CDE this year. During the General Livestock Career Development Event (CDE), students work within teams to rank breeding and market classes of beef, sheep, goats, and swine. Students participating in this CDE make accurate and logical observations of livestock, decide on the desirable traits in marketing and breeding livestock, and select and market livestock that will satisfy consumer demands. Cortney placed 38th out of 805 competitors from Ohio, Indiana and Kentucky at the Wilmington College Aggies CDE. The Equine Management CDE is an educational contest designed as a practical method of teaching students current horse evaluation and selection techniques in addition to developing management skills necessary for success in the equine industry. The Equine Management CDE requires students to identify various types of equine tack and equipment, evaluate different types of hay, place 4 classes of western or english horses, as well as take a written exam. Members of the team this year are: Anna Hagen and Owen Willoby.

On February 9, 2024 Brendan Serr and TJ Reese competed in the Ag Power CDE. In this CDE they were given five pieces of equipment that each had two bugs and were tasked with identifying and solving the problem. The boys placed 23<sup>rd</sup> in the District!



Throughout National FFA week there were multiple opportunities for students to earn points for their field day teams. Each day there was a trivia question that would come over the announcements and the first to answer it right would get points for their team. There would also be a jar with a certain number of various shop items in it that students would have to guess and whoever gets closest to the correct number would get points for their team. Each day there was a dress up theme day and whichever team got the most participants would get points for the team as well. At the end of the week there was a dodgeball tournament where the winner would get points toward their field day team. Congratulations to the 8<sup>th</sup> Grade for winning the Dodgeball Tournament
