

Tickets are available for purchase at the school for \$30 each.




# Academic Awards Programs 6<sup>th</sup> – 12<sup>th</sup> Grade Students



Congratulations to the following students who participated in the Shelby County Science Day held at Anna High School on February 6th.


Sam Scott and Tysen Gariety earned an Excellent rating.

They did very well and had fun!






















The Jackson Center UVCC FCCLA had a very successful regional competition.
