

The Jackson Center - UVCC FCCLA completed a successful FACTS week program.

It all began back in mid-December when John Gordon came to speak to 9 - 12 grade students about traffic safety. John Gordon shared with students the story of his son Rusty, and how he was tragically killed by a texting driver. You can learn more on their Facebook page Rusty's Story or their website www.rustysstory.com.

The FCCLA was awarded a 1000.00 Ohio FCCLA FACTS grant to carry out their projects. In January Jackson FCCLA students hosted a FACTS (Families Acting for Community Traffic Safety) week. This included traffic safety facts on the daily announcements. There was also a TikTok contest for 9-12 grade students, a poem contest for 5th - 8th-grade students, and a coloring contest for Pre-k - 4th-grade students.



Next Mrs. Kipker's second-period Personal Wellness class helped assemble Winter survival kits. These kits contained a flashlight, gloves, fruit snacks, a granola bar, a bottle of water, and a Tips sheet. Once assembled the kits were then passed out to 10-12 grade students.



The Jackson Center FCCLA chapter recently sponsored a diabetes awareness service project. The project was co-chaired by Audrey Byrd and Corinne York. Shirts were sold in order to raise money for insulin pumps and continuous glucose monitor patches. These patches allow the devices to stay in place longer. They raised a total of \$244.96. This allowed them to be able to donate a total of 430 patches to Dayton Children's Hospital Endocrinology Center!

They also created multiple boards with many different facts on them to help bring awareness to the topic. On March 1, 2022, these boards were displayed in the cafeteria for multiple grade levels to see during their lunch periods. Students were also invited to wear their diabetes t-shirts or the color blue on that day.
