Mrs. Kohler will also announce when college reps will be here so that you can sign up in her office.

College Visitations

There are two ways to set up a college visit. 1. Set it up yourself. 2. See Mrs. Kohler and tell her what college you are interested in visiting and what date. She can make the reservation for you. Either way, Mrs. Kohler will give you a form to get signed while at the college to verify you were there. This form is your pass back to JC so that your absence will be excused. Without the form your absence will be counted as unexcused for that day! You are given two college visits this year. Please use them wisely!

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Hints for a Good College Visit

Develop a list of questions and plan specific activities in order to accomplish your goals:

- ☐ Visit while college is in session.
- ☐ Meet with an admissions representative.
- ☐ Verify admission requirements/deadlines.*
- ☐ Meet with financial aid representatives.
- ☐ Learn scholarship and financial aid requirements and deadlines*
- ☐ Discuss academic and social fit issues.
- ☐ Obtain catalogs, calendars, and literature.
- ☐ Meet with faculty and students.
- ☐ Talk with the career services representatives.
- ☐ Tour the campus; see if it is the "right fit" for you.
- ☐ Talk to students about the general academic environment and the study commitment necessary for success.
- ☐ Ask questions about the student activities—clubs, organizations, sports, etc.
- ☐ Inquire about campus life and social activities that interest you.
- ☐ Investigate the transportation options, school shuttle, parking, etc.

In your packet is a list of all Ohio colleges/universities with their phone numbers and websites for you to browse through.

ACT/SAT

If you are planning to apply to a college or tech school, you might want to give them your ACT/SAT scores. Some colleges require the writing portion of the ACT; check the college you are interested in to see if they require it as some schools are test optional.

Registration packets, which include sample questions from old ACT tests, are available in the brochure holder outside of the main office. I also have a few books and videos with sample tests available for students to check out. You are encouraged to register online at www.actstudent.org. On your ACT registration you will be asked our school CEEB code, it is **362-705**. Please use this number so that I get your results and can put them on your transcript. If you are applying to the NCAA Clearinghouse, then also have your scores sent to 9999 or the NAIA - 9876.

If by chance you are interested in a college/university, which requires the SAT - registration forms, test dates, and practice material is available in the Guidance Office or you can go on-line at www.collegeboard.com to register.

Here are the ACT registration deadline and test dates for the 2024 - 2025 academic year:

District vs National ACT Testing

JCHS will host an ACT district test date on Tuesday, October 15th here at JCHS. Mrs. Kohler will register the students for district testing. The fee is \$44.50 due to Mrs. Kohler by September 1st if you wish to participate.

If one wants to take the ACT on a national test date the student must register themselves (including the fee). Mrs. Kohler is not able to register a student for a national test date.

Scholarships

If you know for sure which college or university you plan to attend, send in your application early, doing so will enable you to apply for scholarships offered by that institution. Be sure to ask for that information when you apply. Individual colleges are an excellent source of financial assistance, whether through scholarships or various grants and in-house programs, such as work-study.

Some colleges have an early application deadline, such as OSU – Nov. 1st. Be sure you are aware of their deadlines so you don't miss out on any scholarship money.

Be careful of any scholarship application or scholarship search that asks for money up front. It is probably not legit. In nearly every case, you can get the same information through other sources.

Don't forget to check with your parent's employers, your employers, church, etc., for any scholarships or loans that they might have available for you. Just remember, that *you may not get a scholarship for which you apply—but you will never get one for which you haven't applied!*

I will keep you updated of all the scholarship applications that the Guidance Office receives in your bi-monthly senior updates. In the updates you will find what the scholarship is, required criteria and deadline. New scholarships will be listed in the update but will not be repeated in future updates, so please keep track of them yourself. If you see one you would like to apply

for, see Mrs. Kohler in the Guidance Office for an application.

Colleges are now required to post a "Net Price Calculator" on their website. This calculator provides you with financial aid information based on your ACT/SAT scores and GPA. Many times this information can be found under the Financial Aid link on their website.

Local Scholarships:

The Education Foundation Scholarship application and the 4-H/FFA Scholarship application will be passed out in late January/early February.

All other local scholarship applications (i.e. Airstream, EMI, Lacal, etc.) will be available on our school website in early March and due back to Mrs. Kohler in early April. Mrs. Kohler will provide you with a list of the local scholarships and their criteria at the beginning of March.

Career Information

For the past several years you have been doing career interest and ability inventories with Mrs. Kipker and I to help you choose the career that is best suited for you. I keep a record of this information in my office in what is called a CIP folder for each of you. Please use this Career Passport for job, college, and/or scholarship interviews.

Every once in a while I will get information of a job opening in our area. I will put this information in the Senior Update. Please read your "Updates" they will be filled with valuable information!
