##### Service Academy Nomination Process:

- In your junior year the application process starts for the Academies by filling out the pre-candidate questionnaires – available March 1<sup>st</sup> every year.
- Between March 1<sup>st</sup> of your junior year and Dec. 31<sup>st</sup> of your senior year you must request nominations from the state’s congressional representatives.
- To apply one must complete an application form and various other materials depending on the nominator (Senator/Representative). A review board will select the final candidates.
